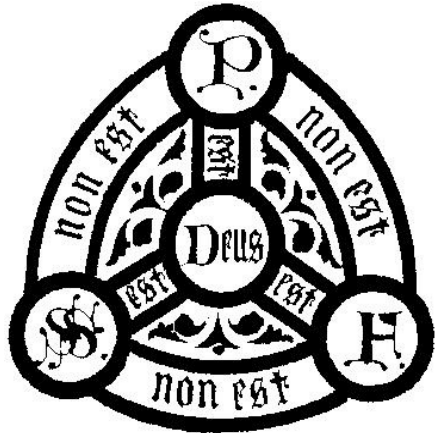

Corporate Confession
